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Duties of Boards

Board of Adjustment: The Board of Adjustment considers requests for variances and appeals of administrative decisions or interpretations of the Pinehurst Development Ordinance. This Board meets on the third Thursday of every month as needed. Meetings begin at 4:00 p.m.

Community Appearance Commission: The Community Appearance Commission reviews and makes recommendations regarding all plans for single family building permits. In reviewing these requests, the Commission works with the builder to ensure that both site and building design are appropriate for Pinehurst and will enhance the Village. The Commission also performs final inspections on all sites to see that development is carried out as indicated during the initial meetings. The Commission works on long-term projects that impact the appearance of the Village. The Commission meets at the sub-committee level with builders every Tuesday at 9:00 a.m. These meetings last about two and one-half hours. Inspections are done after the builders' meetings. Each sub-committee works two consecutive weeks and takes off the third week. On the first Tuesday of each month, the entire Commission meets from 8:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. During these meetings, the Commission discusses member's concerns and long-range projects.

Conservation Commission: The Conservation Commission promotes and coordinates the acquisition, preservation and enhancement of the Village's unique natural resources. Committees within the Conservation Commission include the Open Space Committee, the Tree Preservation Committee, the Water Conservation Committee, the Recycling and Hazardous Waste Disposal Committee, the Greenway Wildlife Habitat Committee and the Community Outreach Committee. The Conservation Commission membership consists of the chairmen of these committees and meets on bi-monthly on Mondays, beginning in January.

Historic Preservation Commission: The Historic Preservation Commission will review and either approve or reject plans for new construction and remodeling in the Local Historic District. This Board meets the 4th Thursday of each month at 4 p.m.

Planning and Zoning Board: In general, the Planning and Zoning Board studies all aspects of physical development in the Village, and either takes action on requests for development, or makes recommendations to the Village Council on development issues. Specifically, the Planning and Zoning Board reviews all requests for building permits in Old Town, permanent signs, major site plans, special use permits, and amendments to the zoning map or the text of the Development Ordinance.

This Board meets the first and second Thursday of the month at 4:00 p.m. Occasionally, the Board will have special meetings to study a specific topic.

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
